The air show, held annually in conjunction with Cheyenne Frontier Days, the world's largest outdoor rodeo, features static and aerial displays of everything from the C-5 Galaxy to a vintage Stearman.

Event organizers said although there were fewer planes on the ramp this year, the big ticket items, like the C-5, were still able to make it.

"It's a crap shoot every year as to who will be available and able to support our event," said Capt. Kurt Anderson. "We're really very lucky, compared to some other small-scale shows, to have the same players here every year."

Student Flight helps new recruits succeed in Basic Training

New recruits to the wing, who are also new to the Air Force and the Air National Guard, participate in a unique program designed to prepare new Airmen for the rigors of basic military training.

The student flight, as it is known, has an average of 18 recruits in civilian clothes or black uniforms each UTA weekend.

“Our primary goal is to prepare students for successful completion of BMT as well as prepare them for a career in the Air Force and the Wyoming Air National Guard,” said Senior Master Sgt. Norman “Buckey” Walters, student flight coordinator.

The student flight teaches prospective unit members drill and ceremonies, customs and courtesies, rank structure and a heavy emphasis on physical fitness. Time spent in student flight is variable depending on the recruits status, in some cases, if the recruit is still in high school, the student may train in the flight for up to nine or 10 months. Members who have completed basic military training and have down time until their technical school begins are also part of student flight.

Walters said the top reason recruits do not make it through basic training is physical fitness. “Making sure the recruits can pass the physical fitness test is very important,” he said. “They take their oaths and are members of the unit who are

just waiting to go to basic training.”

A normal student flight UTA consists of classroom training centered around basic military knowledge, introductory lessons on drill, visits from a former student

flight trainee or guest speaker, intense sessions on reporting statements and general information on what to expect at basic military training. Sunday afternoons are sponsor days for the student flight as the recruits get a chance to work in sections they will be assigned to upon completion of training.

Walters reminds members of the Wing that the student flight is training during the UTA weekend and suggested:

1. Do not speak to recruits while they are in formation.
2. Recruits should be addressed as “Trainee (last name).”
3. Appropriate military custom and courtesies should be used.

“We’re providing them a disservice by being nice and not following through with the expectations,” said Walters. “It adds to the shock when they arrive at BMT.”

PASS & REGISTRATION SECURITY CLEARANCES

In order to register a vehicle with the 153 SFS Pass & Registration, you must have your military ID (dependents need their ID), vehicle registration and current proof of insurance. Civilian employees without a military ID must have a Wyoming Military Department Employee ID.

Due to a change in the DoD vehicle registration database, we now need to have a copy of the vehicle registration for each of your vehicles registered with us, before we can update registrations on your vehicles.

In accordance with AFI 31-204, AIR FORCE MOTOR VEHICLE TRAFFIC SUPERVISION, "a person need not own the vehicle to register it; however, they must have a lease agreement, power of attorney, or notarized statement from the owner of the vehicle granting them permission to use the vehicle and specifying the inclusive use dates."

As a reminder, Pass & Registration's hours are 0700-1630 Monday through Friday (including Fridays before UTAs). UTA hours: Saturday 0830-1630 and Sunday 0800-1600.

Address all Pass & ID questions to Master Sgt. Nate Cook at 772-6192.
